The project is designed not merely to automate legal information, but to make complex legal and administrative requirements more accessible while maintaining clear distinctions between general AI-assisted information and individualized legal advice.

This approach reflects an important model of responsible AI deployment. It addresses questions of reliability, transparency, professional responsibility, and the circumstances in which automated assistance must defer to qualified legal professionals.



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Ms. Fursenko's contribution is further supported by her substantial legal and academic background. She holds the degree of Candidate of Legal Sciences and has extensive experience in university teaching, legal research, international and immigration law, constitutional law, human rights protection, and legal assistance for migrants and persons under temporary protection.

Her work across Ukrainian, Spanish, European, and international legal frameworks gives her a distinctive perspective on cross-border legal challenges and the responsible use of emerging technologies in services affecting vulnerable and internationally dispersed communities.

We also recognize Ms. Fursenko as the author of the Legal Bridge Method, a registered practice-oriented methodology integrating legal assistance, legal education, and mechanisms for protecting migrants and forcibly displaced persons. Together with LegalPilot, this work demonstrates a sustained effort to transform specialized legal expertise into structured, scalable, and technology-enabled approaches to improving access to legal information and justice.

Her broader professional record includes academic publications, university teaching, legal practice, research, and international recognition related to immigration law, legal support for the Ukrainian diaspora, and human rights protection.
